What do you think the wolf looks like?

Pencil Control:

Draw or paint your own forest picture that includes a safe path through it for Little Red Riding hood to get from her house to Grandma's. Make sure it is wiggly!! When it is finished could you carefully move your pencil along the path, keeping within the lines! (See pencil control sheet example).

Use your scissor skills to cut out the character masks. Can you adopt the role of a character from the story and act it out? You may want to involve an adult or sibling in your role play ©

Use your turn taking skills and counting to complete the Little Red Riding Hood board game.

Put yourself in the mindset of each of the characters, how would they be feeling or what might they be saying? Fill in the character bubble with what they might be feeling or saying.

Textures:

Go on a hunt around your house or outside to find different textures to feel. Are any of these what you would think Little Red Riding Hood's cloak or the Wolf's fur would feel like? See if there are any textures that you could collect (old clothes to cut up, leaves, petals etc) and create a collage of textures for either the Wolf or Little Red Riding Hood's cloak (template provided).
