


Example letter pretending to be Jim (See the website for Miss Hawkins modelling and highlighting key features)

Harry Paye 1360? - 1419



Harry Paye was a privateer smuggler from **Poole** in Dorset during the late 14th and early 15th century. He became a commander in the Cinque Ports fleet. He intercepted hundreds of French ships for gold wine, exotic fruits and brought it **back to the people of Poole**.

People still remember and celebrate Harry Paye each year. At Poole Quay there is a parade where everyone dresses up as pirates.

Sir Francis Drake 1540—1596

Sir Francis Drake was an **English** sea captain, privateer, slave trader, pirate, naval officer and explorer during the reign of Queen Elizabeth I. He **worked for the Queen** and he stole lots from Spanish ships! Drake carried out the second **circumnavigation** of the world in a single expedition.





Here are the definitions below:

Topi - decorative round hat worn by men and boys to the mosque.

Prayer mat with compass - important that Muslims come to prayer in a clean state. It should not be stood on wearing shoes. The compass tells them which way Mecca is - Muslims all face Mecca to pray.

Qur'an and Qur'an Stand - this is the holy book of Islam. It should never be placed on the ground and should be wrapped in a clean cloth above head height. A person should always wash before handling the Qur'an.

Tasbe or Subha - prayer beads

Mehndi book - many people decorate their hands for festivals and special occasions
