Date	Key Events
1890	Begins life as a football club, known as Boscombe St John's Institute F.C.
1972	After some name changes, finally settles as AFC Bournemouth.
1996	The club has been in financial trouble for a few years and owed money to different people and groups.
1997	The town's "Save the Cherries" campaign keeps the club going
2008-09	The club almost closes because they don't have enough money.
2015	The club is promoted to the Premier League.


