conflict	strong disagreement or bad feeling between people
consequences	a result or effect
cooperation	the act of working together
denied	to say that something is not true; refuse to agree with
empathy	identifying with or sharing of another's feelings, situation, or attitudes
goals	a result or end that a person wants and works for
hopes	a wish for something that one thinks could come true
learning charter	agreed rules to follow at school
migrant	a person who travels from place to place to find work
motivation	wanting to act by giving incentive or inspiration
opportunities	a chance for a better situation
participation	to take part or join in.
persecution	the act of continually treating others in a cruel way because of race, religion, politics, or some other difference; or the condition of being treated in this way
poverty	the condition of being poor: a lack of money
prejudice	hatred or unfair treatment toward a person or group without cause
privilege	a right or benefit given only to a certain person, group, or social class
refugee	a person forced to leave his or her home or country to seek safety
responsibilities	something for which a person is responsible; duty
rewards	something of value promised to someone for good works or deeds
rights	in keeping with the rules of justice, law, or society
vision	the power to see future events or ideas
