Learning Intentions—PSHE

Understand that, sometimes, we make assumptions based on what people look like

Understand what influences me to make assumptions based on how people look

Know that sometimes bullying is hard to spot and I know what to do if I think it is going on but I'm not sure

Tell you why witnesses sometimes join in with bullying and sometimes don't tell

Identify what is special about me and value the ways in which I am unique

Tell you a time when my first impression of someone changed when I got to know them

Learning intentions

Problem-solve a bullying situation with others

Vocabulary

accept	to think of as true or correct
appearance	the way in which someone is dressed or the way they look
assumptions	something that is supposed or believed without questioning
attitude	a way of feeling or thinking about something or someone
bully	a person who frightens or hurts over and over again
bullying	to frighten or hurt over and over again
bystander	someone who happens to be present when something takes place but does not take part in it
character	all those things that make a person, place, or thing different from others
deliberate	something said or done on purpose
influence	the power or invisible action of a thing or person that causes some kind of effect on another
judgement	an opinion formed after carefully studying all of the information
on purpose	a deliberate action
opinion	a person's thought about something
problem solve	ways in which to deal with a problem
surprised	shocked or amazed by something unexpected
troll	Someone trying to get people to say unkind things online
witness	a person who sees or hears something that happened
