Learning Intentions—PSHE

career	the work a person chooses to do through life
communication	the sharing or exchange of messages, information, or ideas
contribution	To give or offer something
cooperation	the act of working together
culture	the language, customs, ideas, and art of a particular group of people
determination	the quality of having a firm goal and sticking with it.
dreams	a strong hope or goal
goal	a result or end that a person wants and works for
hope	a feeling or chance that something will happen the way one wants it to
lifestyle	the general way of life of a person or group, including typical jobs and activities, attitudes towards work and money, values, and the like
motivated	to cause to act by giving incentive or inspiration
perseverance	to continue in a task with determination
profession	a job or type of work that needs training or study
rallying	to unite again or raise the spirits of after a disappointment or failure
salary	a fixed amount of money paid at regular times for the work a person has done
