

Choose at least 1 of these tricky word tasks

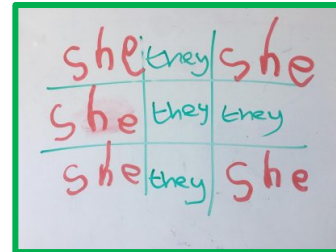
Tricky word hunt

Find tricky words I, go, to the, he, she, we, me, be, was, you in books/magazines. Can you cut them up to make your own tricky word mat?



Tricky word noughts and crosses

Play noughts and crosses with tricky words - two players each take a tricky word and they must use this as their O or X in the grid, writing it down as per the usual game. The winner is the first to get three of their tricky word in a row.



Tricky word passcode

Instead of inserting numbers like onto a smart phone, write tricky words into the passcode template and stick it to the inside of a door in your house. In order to open the door, your child has to 'key in' your chosen passcode, or series of tricky words. The passcode can be changed each day to allow the practicing of different tricky words and a new pattern to remember.



Get your hands dirty!

As you cook, clean or garden, you could use the bubbles, mud or flour to practice writing your tricky words or even correct the adult's mistakes of their tricky word spelling.



Make some noise!

Get out the pots and pans, putting the tricky words on top and have your child create some noise with the pots and pans whilst practicing their tricky words.
