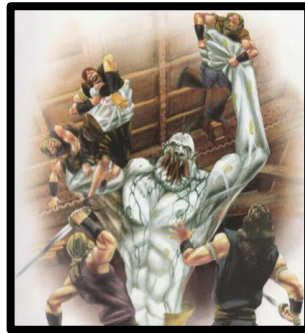

LO: Can I use adverbs and fronted adverbials?


